Elected Member of the Académie française in 2008, Jean-Luc Marion is Professor of Philosophy, Université de Paris-Sorbonne and Andrew Thomas Greeley and Grace McNichols Greeley Professor of Catholic Studies and Professor of the Philosophy of Religions and Theology at the University of Chicago. Winner of the 1992 Grand Prix de Philosophie de l'Académie française and the 2008 Karl-Jaspers Preis, Marion is author of numerous groundbreaking works treating the history of early modern philosophy, contemporary phenomenology, and the interplay of phenomenology and theology, including, *Descartes' Metaphysical Prism*, *Being Given: An Essay on the Phenomenology of Givenness*, and *God Without Being*. He has recently published *Au lieu de soi: L'approche de saint Augustin* (English translation forthcoming) on the understanding of the self in Augustine of Hippo.
